We are planning to hold our first meeting at the start of next half term and would love to hear from anyone interested in being involved.

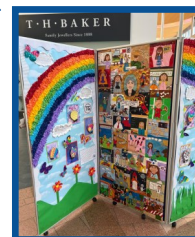
