Look Up and Live Parent Workshop

The Brianna Ghey Legacy Project will be delivering a Look Up and Live parent workshop on Tuesday 16th June at 9:00am in the school hall.

This date was chosen by the majority of parents who responded to the poll sent out earlier this year. The workshop is designed to help parents and carers understand the impact of smartphones, social media and screen time on children's mental health and wellbeing, while also offering practical strategies for setting boundaries, managing resistance and supporting healthy digital habits at home.

As part of our commitment to supporting children's wellbeing, pupils in Years 5 and 6 will also take part in their own Look Up and Live workshops on 22nd June. These age-appropriate sessions will encourage children to think about their relationship with technology, the importance of real-life connections and how to make positive choices online.

Spotlight on Reception!

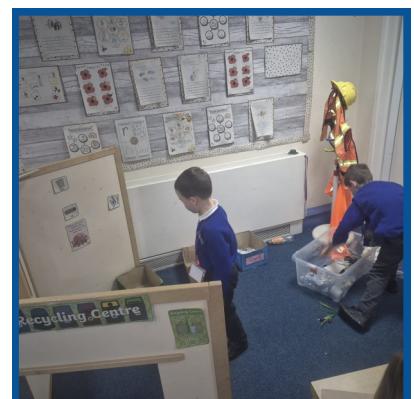
We have been very busy in Reception as we begin to prepare for our transition into Year 1! Reception have made Miss Bowen very welcome and impressed her with their fantastic knowledge and skills.

In literacy we have been using digraphs and tricky words to write super sentences linked to our key texts. We've enjoyed a wide range of high quality texts including *Somebody Swallowed Stanley* which has really caught their interest with the wider messages of the story. Children have begun to create important messages about looking after our sea creatures.

In maths we have been securing skills such as recalling number bonds to 5 and some number bonds to 10, subitising, talking about and finishing patterns as well as using mathematical language to talk about what we notice. In maths children often work in partners or a small group and they have proven the value of respect as they listen and respond to each other!

Children are getting very excited for upcoming events. We've been practising our balancing, jumping, running and teamwork skills in P.E. as preparation for Sports Day. We've been working on our resilience as we rehearse for our Sunshine Assembly which reflects our learning and favourite memories from the year.

We are also learning lots about animals, their young and where they live. We are SUPER excited to visit Smithills Farm next week to see some of our learning come to life in real life experiences.

PSHE and RSHE Update

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be sharing information with families about some new statutory guidance for Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) that comes into effect from September. As part of this process, we will be inviting families to take part in a consultation about our PSHE and RSHE curriculum.

We are continuing to use the Jigsaw PSHE programme, which is already well established across the school. Jigsaw's updated materials help us meet all of the required curriculum content while continuing to promote the values that are important to our school community.

This half term, children will be exploring the Jigsaw unit Changing Me. These lessons help children prepare for transitions, such as moving to a new class or school, while also learning about the changes that happen as we grow and develop. The lessons will be taught over the next few weeks in an age-appropriate and sensitive way.

Families can view the lesson materials, including the key vocabulary that will be used with children, through the Jigsaw Parent Portal. Download codes will be sent out via SchoolPing next week. If you have any questions about the materials or experience any difficulties accessing the Parent Portal, please contact your child's class teacher or Mrs Kelly (PSHE Lead) through the school office.
