Mental Health and Wellbeing

At Twiss Green we are committed to supporting the mental health and wellbeing of all members of our school community. This year, we have addressed this in a number of ways for our children including nurture groups and nurture support for individuals, the development of our Sunshine Room and calm boxes and calm corners in our classrooms. Our Year 4 class have also been trialling sessions from the myHappyMind programme, which supports positive mental wellbeing. After Easter, this will be rolled out across school. We are also beginning to support individual children through ELSA. ELSAs are emotional literacy support assistants working in schools.

They:

- Help children recognise, understand and manage emotions to increase success.
- Plan and deliver individual (and small group) support programmes.
- Receive training and supervision from educational psychologists.

Mrs Bishop will be delivering ELSA sessions to our children and has been trained to do so by Warrington's Educational Psychology Team. Parents/carers will be informed if their child's class teacher feels they may benefit from ELSA support. ELSA sessions will take place in our newly revamped Rainbow Room (next to Year 5's classroom).

As a school, we are working towards achieving a Wellbeing Award which provides us with a framework to support this very important work.


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Dojos
