Remote Learning:

The teachers are working really hard to provide not only the teaching in the classroom, but also a full week's learning for those children who are isolating but well enough to work. We would ask, if your children are at home, that you support them in engaging with this and that they send something via Seesaw each morning before 9:20 am so that we know they are okay and learning. Covid update: You will probably all be aware that the guidance has changed: From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.
